The BACK PORCH EXHIBIT is open to PASCO COUNTY residents age 18 and over. All entered items must have been completed since the 2009 Pasco County Fair. Entries should be clean with complete name and address, zip code and phone number on the back of each item for your protection. Wall hangings and pictures should be mounted or wired for hanging. Entries must be the handiwork of the exhibitor.

Each entry will be judged and will receive a ribbon based on its own merit. Each entry will be given the color of ribbon it deserves: First (blue), Second (red), Third (white). GRAND CHAMPION ROSETTES will be awarded for the superior entry in each section according to the discretion of the judges. A RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION ROSETTE may be awarded to the runner-up if the judges see fit to do so. An AWARD OF EXCELLENCE ROSETTE may be given in any section or class at the discretion of the judges. A "People's Choice" award will be given on Sunday, Feb. 21, to the entry that has received the most votes during the week of the fair.

In addition to the above named ribbons entries will receive cash awards of: Blue - \$3.00, Red - \$2.00, White \$1.00. Grand Champions Rosettes - \$5.00 and Reserve Grand Champion rosettes - \$3.00, Award of Excellence - \$2.00.

The Back Porch committee has the authority to make changes in the Rules and Regulations when necessary. The Pasco County Fair Association does not assume responsibility for damage or loss of items exhibited, although reasonable care will be exercised to safeguard entries on display. The Back Porch Exhibit will be closed to the general public from 10 p.m. each night and will reopen with supervision just prior to the opening of the fair each day.
